This professorship is intended to strengthen the research area of "Science Communication in Digital Media" at KIT. Experience and qualification in science communication research and education theoretically and methodologically based on communication science, journalism or related areas of sociology are indispensable. Candidates are expected to have an outstanding research and publication record as well as to be part of an established international network. Excellent achievements in the practice of science communication are required.

Your future education tasks will cover research-oriented teaching in the interdisciplinary program of Science – Media – Communication (B.A./M.A.) and participation in methodological teaching. Candidates are expected to take part in the self-administration of the Science Communication Unit of the Institute for German Studies and to work in the bodies of KIT.

Your employment shall be subject to the conditions outlined in Article 47, LHG (Law of Baden-Wuerttemberg on Universities and Colleges). A post-doctoral lecture qualification in one of the subjects relevant to this professorship or equivalent scientific achievements and teaching experience are needed.

The KIT aims to increase the proportion of female professors and therefore welcomes the application of suitably qualified women. Handicapped applicants will be given preference when equally qualified.
