



What is HEIRRI?

HEIRRI (Higher Education Institutions & Responsible Research and Innovation) is a European project that aims to integrate the concept of "Responsible Research and Innovation", or RRI, in the science and engineering degrees, mainly focusing on universities and other higher education institutions (HEIs). HEIRRI started on September 1st 2015, it will last three years and it has an approximate budget of one and a half million euros.

HEIRRI is led by **Universitat Pompeu Fabra** and the HEIRRI Consortium is composed by the **Aarhus University** (Denmark), the **University of Bergen** (Norway), the **University of Split** (Croatia), the **Institute for Advanced Studies** (Austria), **"Ia Caixa" Foundation** (Spain), the company **Innovatec** (Spain), the European network of science centres and museums **Ecsite** (with more than 400 institutions from 50 countries) and the **Catalan Association of Public Universities** (ACUP, which chairs **GUNi**, the Global University Network for Innovation, with 208 universities in 78 countries).
