
Example: Golden Mummies of Egypt (2020)


Carbon footprint: 165.139 tonnes CO2e

Example: Golden Mummies of Egypt (2021)


Carbon footprint: 54.745 tonnes CO2e



How we manage offsetting

Offsetting IS:

- A last resort in your carbon strategy
- A method of accounting for emission you can't avoid using existing technology or solutions
- An engagement opportunity

Offsetting IS NOT:

- A reliable means to reduce carbon tonne for tonne
- A substitute for action to avoid or reduce emissions at source
- An excuse to carry on with business as usual
